Fund Commentary

Financial markets continued their push higher as they largely shrugged off a gradually slowing economy with the help of the Federal Reserve officially pivoting to rate cuts and the expectation for those cuts to continue. We saw the beginnings of a rotation and broadening out of the equity market away from the dominance of mega-capitalization tech companies that has defined the past year and a half.

The strategy generated strong absolute returns but underperformed its benchmark during the quarter. This return profile is consistent with the portfolio's history of providing a level of downside risk management during adverse equity market environments, while generating positive returns that may not quite keep pace with the benchmark during especially strong markets for value stocks such as experienced this quarter.

Sector positioning was the primary headwind with regard to relative performance this quarter, while the specific companies owned had a slightly negative impact on relative return. The strategy's significant overweight to Energy, the only sector to post a negative return this quarter, weighed heavily on relative returns. In addition, the lack of exposure to Real Estate and Utilities, the two best performing sectors which benefitted from the declining interest rate environment, were also notable detractors this quarter. The specific Health Care companies owned, led by Bristol-Myers Squibb and Gilead Sciences, aided relative returns.

From a factor standpoint, the strategy's focus on free cash flow generating, dividend paying stocks with sustainable dividend policies, typically results in exposure to quality-oriented factors such as high return on equity (ROE), which offers a gauge of profit-generating efficiency. Likewise, the emphasis on dividends leads the portfolio to skew towards the large- to mega-capitalization area of the investable universe. These characteristics had limited impact on relative returns this quarter.

The strategy will remain invested in financially sound companies with sustainable dividend policies trading at attractive valuations. The valuation component seeks to identify companies that trade at an attractive price relative to their underlying earnings power (e.g., free cash flow). We believe that investing in companies with both favorable valuations and a commitment to returning capital to shareholders via dividends results in a strategy that not only provides the potential for competitive returns in positive market environments but also offers downside risk management during market downturns.

Definitions

Alpha: A measure of an investment's performance relative to a benchmark index. It represents the excess return of an investment compared to the return of the benchmark. Beta: A measure of an investment's volatility relative to the overall market.

 $\textbf{Standard Deviation:} \ A \ statistical \ measure \ of the \ dispersion \ of \ returns \ for \ a \ given \ investment. \ It \ quantifies \ the \ amount \ of \ variation \ or \ volatility \ from \ the \ average \ return.$

Sharpe Ratio: A measure of risk-adjusted return, calculated by subtracting the risk-free rate from the investment's return and then dividing by its standard deviation.

Market Capture: Up market capture is the % of market return captured by the investment manager's return relative to the benchmark during positive periods while down market capture is the % of market return captured by the investment manager's return relative to the benchmark during negative periods.

Manning & Napier Fund, Inc. Disciplined Value Series I was rated against Large Value funds and had a 2 star rating for the three year, a 2 star rating for the five year, a 3 star rating for the ten year, and a 3 star rating overall, as of 09/30/2024, out of 1085, 1031, 804, and 1085 funds respectively. Ratings for other share classes may differ. The Morningstar Ratingrm for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Ratingrm for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-and ten-year (if applicable) Morningstar Ratingrm metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/50% five-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period.
